


Objectives:

- 3. Facilitating the application of suitable probation measures and alternative sanctions




Foreign Prisoners in EU





Large variation in numbers of Foreign Prisoners across EU



Population in Prison in U.K. by Nationality



Based on stated nationality upon entering prison (some N.I. may have stated Irish nationality) 1st June 2010







Foreign Nationals on Probation Service Caseload
