

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CONTENT

The Council Framework Decision 2008/947/JHA deals with the application of the principle of mutual recognition to judgments and probation decisions with a view to the supervision of probation measures and alternative sanctions. Member States will need to take all the necessary measures to comply with the provisions of this Framework Decision by 6 December 2011.

We are convinced that successful implementation relies on a clear understanding of the discrepancies between national systems.

The aim of this seminar is therefore to improve the mutual knowledge on national probation measures as well as to identify legislative and practical difficulties faced within the implementation process of this European instrument.

Several workshops (4) will be devoted to both legislative and practical aspects of the implementation, and more particularly:

- At legislative level: to horizontal questions raised by the implementation of mutual recognition instruments as well as to other specific questions related to the implementation of the Framework decision on probation measures and alternative sanctions.
- At practical level: to mutual knowledge of probation measures within national systems and, in particular, to potential specific difficulties resulting from the discrepancies between the national systems.
